Dear Neighbor:

In the spirit of ongoing and frequent communication about the safety of our water supply, we wanted to compile and distribute the enclosed Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document that captures the questions that we have fielded from you.

As you now know, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) released its Lifetime Health Advisory, or LHA, for PFCs on May 19. As a result of these rigorous standards, set forth to protect the health and safety of our residents, the Horsham Water and Sewer Authority (HWSA) acted swiftly, shutting down three wells to ensure compliance with EPA guidance. All water provided by HWSA meets or exceeds all state and federal drinking water quality standards, and all nine of our active wells in Horsham show PFC levels significantly below the new EPA Lifetime Health Advisory.

It is worth repeating that we acknowledge and understand your concerns with the safety of our water supply. As residents ourselves, we share them. We thank you for engaging in discussion and providing insightful questions, many of which are reflected in our FAQ document. As Council members, we will deliver on our promise to provide updates that are factual, timely and helpful.
